Full Day Tours

Tour 1: Jerusalem

Sunday, October 14 (depart 9:15 AM)

Depart Tel Aviv via Jaffa which served as port for Jerusalem 3000 years ago. Pass through biblical Emek Ayalon, the monastery of Latrun and hear the story of "Jesus and the good thief". Continue up through Shaar Ha-Gai, the only approach to Jerusalem during the 1948 War of Independence. After lunch (not included) visit the Old-City of Jerusalem and tour on foot, Mt. Zion, King David's Tomb, the Room of the Last-Supper, Dormition Church, Zion Gate, and three Old City Quarters: Armenian, Jewish and Christian.
