INTRODUCTION

This symposium is intended for all those who are confronted during their daily practice with cardiac patients suffering from disabling or life-threatening arrhythmias or conduction disturbances.

Since the 90's clinical electrophysiology has seen an amazing development. After introduction of radio frequency ablation, new imaging and mapping techniques have emerged. New indications as atrial fibrillation, and challenging ventricular arrhythmias now become more or less treatable. The development of alternative energy sources and the perspective of magnetic navigation are tremendous new directions in this field. Further, the genetic background of some syndromes becomes more and more clear.

Atrial fibrillation remains the major problem in clinical arrhythmology: after the major trials on rate and rhythm control, strategic decisions remain as difficult as ever. The fact that thrombo-embolic complications occur with both strategies implies that anticoagulation remains a very important topic.

ICD technology, with improving detection algorithms, painless therapy and combined with multisite pacing finds broader applications. Prophylactic implantation is now established.

Attention will be given to anti-arrhythmic drug therapy programming and follow-up of patients with heart failure and complex arrhythmias.
