

The Interventional Cardiology Research Fellowship

The Israel Heart Society in collaboration with California Chapter of the American College of Cardiology and Save a Heart foundation will co-fund with the Smidt Heart Institute at Cedars-Sinai, an Interventional Cardiology Research Fellowship at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center for 2 years.

The fellowship would be primarily a research fellowship, with approximately 20% clinical activity related to the research. **The fellowship will be non-ACGME. The candidates will be Israeli citizens on a J1 visa**. Candidates would be interviewed by both the Israel Heart Society and Cedars-Sinai Medical Center faculty and representatives. Start date is to be determined with target date of September 1, 2020.

The Salary will be determined by Post-Graduate Year determined by Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. The Salary for a PGY is estimated to be \$81,600.

Description of Curriculum:

Cedars-Sinai Medical Center has been an international leader in the field of interventional cardiology and at the forefront of innovations and advancements in the field of structural heart disease. The Research fellow will have the opportunity to work on a number of research projects and arenas related to interventional cardiology at Cedars-Sinai, with particular focus on the emerging field of structural heart disease. Potential areas of research focus will include but not limited to emerging populations for transcatheter aortic valve replacement, development and testing of new devices for structural heart interventions, and evaluation of newer techniques for percutaneous repair and replacement of the mitral valve. At Cedars Sinai, we have an extensive clinical data base in our interventional program, and the Research fellow will be expected to help expand the current clinical database and participate in organizing and enrolling in current and new clinical trials. The Research fellow will have opportunities in medical technology and device innovation.
