

## **Electrophysiology Fellowship in Stanford University**

The Israel Heart Society in collaboration with California Chapter of the American College of Cardiology and Save a Heart foundation will co-fund with the Stanford Arrhythmia Service a **Cardiac Electrophysiology Research Fellowship** at Stanford for 2 years. The fellowship would be 100% research with clinical contact related to the research, but not include invasive procedures. The fellowship will be non-ACGME. The candidates will be Israeli citizens on a J1 visa. Candidates would be interviewed by both the Israel Heart Society and Stanford faculty or representatives. Start date to be determined with Target July 2020.

The Salary will be determined by Post-Graduate Year determined by Stanford. The Salary for a PGY4 is estimated to be \$81,600.

### Description of Curriculum:

The Research fellow will have the opportunity to work on research using our entire clinical database as well as projects on a range of topics such as genetics of atrial fibrillation, computational approaches to understanding arrhythmias, outcomes in arrhythmia therapy, evaluation and development of new arrhythmia technologies, and digital health solutions in arrhythmias.

The Research fellow will be expected to help expand the current clinical database and participate in organizing and enrolling in current and new clinical trials.

The Research fellow will have opportunities in medical technology and device innovation.
